In this context where so many of us globally are working from home, or have no access to institutional libraries and offices, we again remind members that adding an online subscription to your membership for the five RSA journals is free.

If you are a member of the RSA you have free access to the e-journals, and you can access these by logging into Members Lounge and clicking on Publications.

You may wish to consider if you wish to continue to taking print versions of the journals – we certainly send out a lot of journal issues in a year, and as I know very well, it can absorb a lot of shelf space to accommodate them all.

To support you in the shift to online journals (even if you still take print), you might also consider signing up to journal alerts. Use the links below to receive an alert as new articles or issues are published. I’ve found these push notifications useful in making sure that I continue to scan the contents of the journals and decide which articles I will read.

[New AcSS report: Vital Business: the Essential Role of the Social Sciences in the UK Private Sector](#)

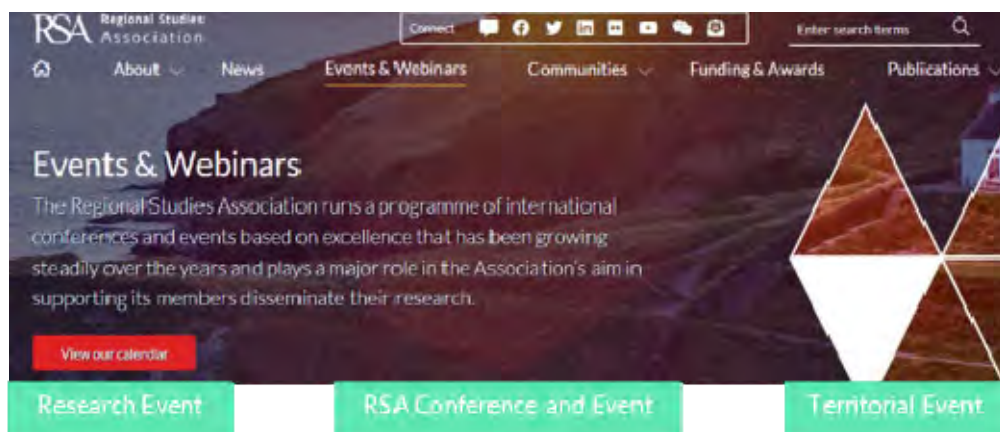
The Academy of Social Sciences has launched a new report - ***Vital Business: the Essential Role of the Social Sciences in the UK Private Sector***. The report is based on eight detailed case studies of leading businesses across sectors including engineering, fintech, energy sectors and the food industry, and challenges some of the myths about the role of the social sciences in the private sector. It shows the social sciences to be widely used and valued by business: in leadership and core operations management; used to understand consumers; to evaluate and manage risk; in strategic planning; and to work on projects and policies requiring understanding of markets, regulation, supply chains, and behaviour.

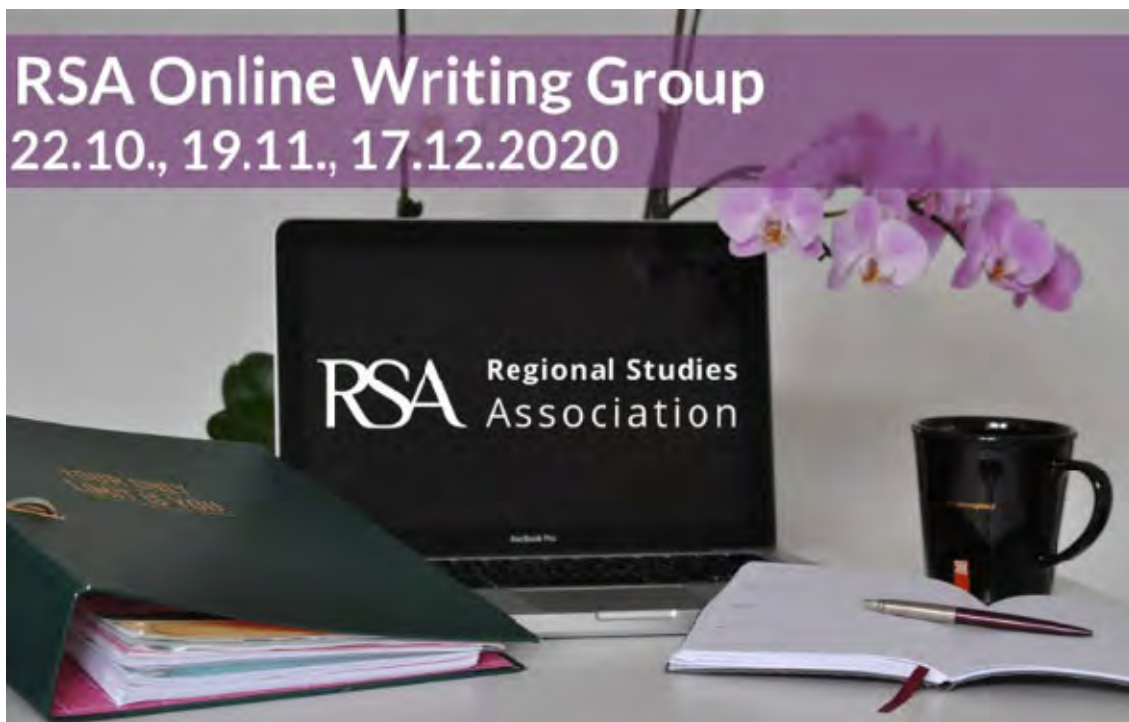

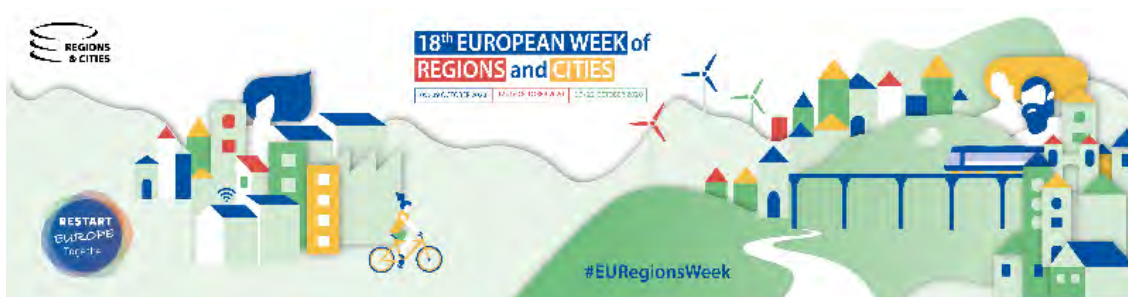

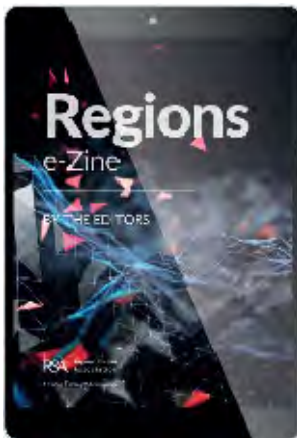

The period between the publication of [Issue 6](#) and the launch of this [Issue 7](#) has been challenging across all sectors of society. The challenges caused by the COVID-19 pandemic have affected work-home relationships, have changed the way we travel, communicate and socialize. It has also called for a rethinking on how to respond jointly in terms of solidarity and cooperation. It is somehow a chance to utilise this moment to act and draft more inclusive and sustainable policy, national and regional development strategies. In this context, financialisation plays a fundamental role.

Articles in this themed [Issue 7](#) address various examples of financialisation in operation, including the growing involvement of [financial mechanisms](#) in the housing sector, [transportation](#) and overall urban and regional development, exploring pros and cons of it.

[Regional Insights](#) features seven articles, from the role of the state in housing

developments in European [countries](#), EU [cities](#), and [Chinese urban regions](#), to the controversial urban development ‘hiccup’ in [Toronto](#). In [Research Frontline](#), Naomi Hazarika discusses the dynamics of urban redevelopment involving the opening up of state lands for private investment in the city of Delhi, India. [Spotlight](#) section features two valuable contributions, one explores the implications of financialization in densification schemes in the UK exposing common issues of affordability and some flaws in the existing planning strategies, the other is an overview of [COVID-19 impacts and responses in Africa and Europe](#).

The articles composing this issue evidence our Regions eZine is reaching far beyond a European readership, with cases from [Ghana](#), Canada, China and India. Within this issue, we also honour the memory of a dear friend, [Professor Paul Benneworth](#), who passed on Tuesday 12th May 2020. With Issue 7, the [Editorship chapter of Stefania Fiorentino and Robert Bowen](#) begins.
